Get to know our Entered Apprentice Brother Michael Smith

1. How did you learn about Masonry for the first time and why did you decide to join Anaheim Lodge?

When I was a very young man of 12 or 13 my step father was involved with the Masons and spoke very highly of the organization. My mother and he divorced and I didn't give much more thought to it until recently when I met Wor. Godeke in passing at the office building where I work, and one day he asked me in to talk about my service in Vietnam. I noticed some portraits displayed in his office and asked him about them. We began talking about Masonry, and I expressed my interest in the organization. He offered to get me an application, and explained the process of being assessed for admission. I submitted the application with the required fees, and now here I am.

2. What is your background and where do you want to be in 5-10 years?

I am the son of a combat Marine/Drill Sargent, Grandson of a Navy Admiral, and Veteran of the Vietnam War. All three of my brothers also served in the military as well. I have for the past 5-6 years been helping homeless veterans acquire the benefits they are entitled to, find employment if they so desire, and find stable housing in order to get off the streets. I have been in college for 4 plus years studying psychology, chemical addiction and post-traumatic stress disorders in order to better understand some of the underlying issues that have caused so many of our past military heroes to fall in to a lifestyle they do not deserve.

3. What is the best advice you have every received and why?

My Grandfather once said, "Do what needs to be done, when it needs to be done, whether you like it or not!" This advice has proved to be very valuable in every aspect of my life. It has helped me to accomplish many tasks/duties that were at times less than desirable but necessary and ultimately my responsibility.
